Update

The Board would like to thank Ray Webber for his recent, very generous donation of time, labor and scaffolding. Ray set up an elaborate array of scaffolding in the sanctuary last month for the church so the light illuminating the communion table and pulpit could be replaced. The work included cutting in an access panel above the light so that in the future the light can be accessed from the attic rather than using staging.

As many of you may recall, repair of the pipe organ was a two-step process. The first step, replacement of the blower motor, was completed in March. The second step was to have the organ tuned which was recently completed by Andover Organ Company. As I'm sure everyone agrees, it's great to have the organ back up and running!

The Board is very pleased to let you know that we have reached our fund-raising goal of \$45,000 for the Building Fund. The funds are helping the church cover the cost of several projects including reroofing the back half of the church and replacement of the parsonage roof shingles. Thanks to the many friends and members of the church who donated so generously to this fund-raiser.

The Board is in the very early stages of planning for a "church maintenance day." This will be a day for volunteers to gather to help with a variety of maintenance items as well to enjoy a time of fellowship. More details to follow.
